

Mathieu Jacomy, the Co-Creator of Gephi, will present the tool and answer all your questions. The workshop includes a crash course on how to use it and why. But it will also cover deeper questions, such as how you are supposed to read a network map, what you can realistically expect from them, and how to write about them in academic publications.

You will need a laptop with internet access, and we will install Gephi together or if you can't install it, use the online version (https://gephi.org/gephi-lite/).

You can optionally bring your own dataset, but it is not necessary, as datasets will be provided.
